

If you liked the Percy Jackson series by Rick Riordan, you might also like:

1. The Alchemyst: The Secrets of the Immortal Nicholas Flamel by Michael Scott. According to legend, Nicholas Flamel discovered the secret of eternal life from the powerful book of Abraham the Mage--a book he has protected since his death in 1418. In the wrong hands, it will destroy the world. When the book is stolen, Sophie and Josh Newman find themselves in the middle of the greatest legend of all time.
2. Anatopsis by Chris Abouzeid. In the realm from which the Greek gods ruled the universe thousands of years ago, the immortal witch Anatopsis uncovers the true objectives of her demi-god tutor Mr. Pound and attempts to prevent him from carrying out his evil plans.
3. Corydon and the Island of Monsters by Tobias Druitt. Corydon, an outcast Greek boy with the leg of a goat, learns that he is part of an old prophecy and joins forces with Medusa and other "monsters" known in Greek mythology in a confrontation with mortal heroes fighting for the Olympian gods.
4. Fablehaven by Brandon Mull. When Kendra and Seth go to stay at their grandparents' estate, they discover that it is a sanctuary for magical creatures and that a battle between good and evil is looming.
5. Gods of Manhattan by Scott Mebus. Thirteen-year-old Rory discovers a spirit world that thrives alongside his contemporary New York City, filled with fantastical creatures and people from the city's colorful past who have become gods and goddesses and who have chosen Rory to perform a dangerous mission.
6. Gregor the Overlander by Suzanne Collins. (Gregor the Overlander series) When eleven-year old Gregor and his two-year old sister fall through a grate in his apartment building, they are hurtled into the dark Underland, a world that is on the brink of an epic battle with men, bats, rats, cockroaches, and spiders on a quest foretold by a prophecy.
7. Iris, Messenger by Sarah Deming. After discovering that the immortals of Greek mythology reside in her hometown of Middleville, Pennsylvania, twelve-year-old Iris listens to their life stories, gaining wisdom, beauty, and startling revelations about her past.
8. The Key to Rondo by Emily Rodda. Through an heirloom music box, Leo, a serious, responsible boy, and his badly-behaved cousin Mimi enter the magical world of Rondo to rescue Mimi's dog from a sorceress, who wishes to exchange him for the key that allows free travel between worlds.
9. Odysseus in the Serpent Maze by Jane Yolen & Robert J. Harris (Young Heroes series) Thirteen-year-old Odysseus, who longs to be a hero, has many opportunities to prove himself during an adventure which involves pirates and satyrs, a trip to Crete's Labyrinth, and the two young girls, Penelope and Helen, who play a major role in his future life.
10. Pandora Gets Jealous by Carolyn Hennesy. Thirteen-year-old Pandi is hauled before Zeus and given six months to gather all of the evils that were released when the box she brought to school as her annual project was accidentally opened.
11. Peter & the Starcatchers by Dave Barry. Soon after Peter, an orphan, sets sail from England on the ship Never Land, he befriends and assists Molly, a young Starcatcher, whose mission is to

guard a trunk of magical stardust from a greedy pirate and the native inhabitants of a remote island.

12. The Pig Scrolls by Paul Shipton. A translation of an ancient Greek manuscript written by Gryllus, a talking pig who was once a man, which describes the many adventures that he and his companions—a junior prophetess named Sybil and a bumbling goatherd—experience while traveling to Delphi to try to prevent the universe from coming to an end.
13. Runemarks by Joanne Harris. Maddy Smith, who bears the mysterious mark of a rune on her hand, learns that she is destined to join the gods of Norse mythology and play a role in the fate of the world.
14. The Sea of Trolls by Nancy Farmer. After Jack becomes apprenticed to a Druid bard, he and his little sister Lucy are captured by Viking Berserkers and taken to the home of King Ivar the Boneless and his half-troll queen, leading Jack to undertake a vital quest to Jotunheim, home of the trolls.
15. Secret of the Sirens by Julia Golding (Companions Quartet, Book 1). Upon moving to her aunt's seaside home in the British Isles, Connie becomes part of a secret society that shelters mythical creatures, and must use her ability to communicate with these beings to protect them from evil and the incursions of humans.
16. The Shadow Thieves by Anne Ursu (Cronos Chronicles) Thirteen-year-old Odysseus, who longs to be a hero, has many opportunities to prove himself during an adventure which involves pirates and satyrs, a trip to Crete's Labyrinth, and the two young girls, Penelope and Helen, who play a major role in his future life.
17. The Supernaturalist by Eoin Colfer. In futuristic Satellite City, fourteen-year-old Cosmo Hill escapes from his abusive orphanage and teams up with three other people who share his unusual ability to see supernatural creatures, and together they determine the nature and purpose of the swarming blue Parasites that are invisible to most humans.
18. Theodosia and the Serpents of Chaos by R. L. LaFevers (e-book) Twelve-year-old Theo uses arcane knowledge and her own special talent when she encounters two secret societies, one sworn to protect the world from ancient Egyptian magic and one planning to harness it to bring chaos to the world, both of which want a valuable artifact stolen from the London museum for which her parents work.
19. Thor's Wedding Day by Bruce Coville. Thialfi, the Norse thunder god's goat boy, tells how he inadvertently helped the giant Thrym to steal Thor's magic hammer, the lengths to which Thor must go to retrieve it, and his own assistance along the way.
20. Walking With the Dead by L. M. Falcone. Alex's father brings home an exhibit for his museum – a 2000 year-old greek corpse. The corpse comes back to life, and Alex and his friend Freddie try to help him – help which includes a trip to the Underworld, and time-travel back to ancient Greece.
